Nick Renshaw's sculpture frequently invokes elements of the human figure as its subject matter.

Working often with such physical, tangible and substantial materials as clay and bronze Renshaw's works are an amalgamation of themes and inspirations from both the memory of his own background and current experiences, as well as from a universally understood language of anthropological and historical visual symbols. His works play on contradictions and opposites as a central part of their understanding, calling of the audience to weigh between seemingly humorous imagery and those of a more mysterious or portentous nature.

Renshaw comes originally from Yorkshire in the north of England and has studied, practiced and taught in many countries, including; the Netherlands, where he studied at both the Gerrit Rietveld Academie and Sandberg Instituut prior to basing his studio in Amsterdam, the UK, USA, and most recently China.

His work has been exhibited widely during the previous two decades and as well as it being in the collection of many private individuals, museums and other related institutions he has undertaken a number of large-scale commissions for public buildings.

Renshaw completed his PhD in 2014 in collaboration with the Ceramic Arts Research Centre of the University of Sunderland (CARCUOS) in the UK, focusing on artist-in-residence centres in general and the European Ceramic Work centre in the Netherlands in particular. 'Demystified: The European Ceramic Work centre as Centre of Excellence', published in 2017, was based on this research.

Skulptúrar Nick Renshaw vekja gjarnar upp þætti mannsformsins sem viðfangsefni. Með því að vinna mikil með áþreifanlegan, tilfinnanlegan og sterkbyggðan efnivið eins og leir og brons eru verk Renshaw samblanda af þemum og innblæstri úr minni hans eigin bakgrunns og núverandi upplifunum, ásamt alþjóðlegu tungumáli mannfræðilegra og sagnfræðilegra sjónrænna tákna. Verk hans snerta á þversögnum og andstæðum sem miðpunktur þess sem er skiljanlegt, og setur þannig í hendur áhorfandans að vega á milli þess sem virðist gamansamt myndmál og þess sem virðist leyndardómsfullt eða geigvænlegt í eðli sínu.

Renshaw kemur upprunalega frá Yorkshire á Englaði og hefur stundað nám, iðkað og kennt í mörgum löndum. Þar á meðal Hollandi þar sem hann stundaði nám í Gerrit Rietveld Academie og Sandberg Instituut áður en hann byggði upp sitt eigið stúdió í Amsterdam, Bretlandi, Bandaríkjum, og nú nýverið í Kína.

Verk hans hafa verið sýnd viða síðustu tvo áratugi ásamt því að vera í einkaeigu margra einstaklinga, safna og annarrar listastofnana. Einnig hefur hann ráðist í mörg verk af stórum skala fyrir opinberar stofnanir eða byggingar.

Renshaw lauk við doktorspróf sitt 2004 í samstarfi við The Ceramic Arts Research Centre of the University of Sunderland (CARCUOS) í Bretlandi, með áherslu á miðstöðvar fyrir listamannadvalir almennt og evrópska keramik vinnumiðstöðvar í Hollandi sérstaklega.

Demystified: The European Ceramic Work Centre as Centre of Excellence, sem gefið var út 2017 var bygt á þessari rannsókn.
